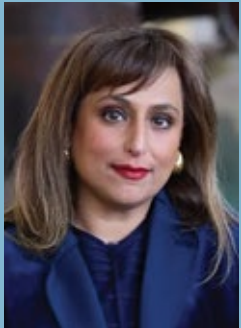


Welcome to Global Studies University

Our History



The Africa Institute, the cornerstone of GSU, traces its roots back to December 1976, when Sharjah hosted the first Symposium on African and Arab Relations. Organized under the patronage of His Highness Sheikh Dr. Sultan bin Muhammad Al-Qasimi, 45 African and Arab intellectuals convened to discuss strengthening ties between Africa and the Arab world. Among the key recommendations was the creation of an institute dedicated to studying, documenting, and advancing Afro-Arab relations in Sharjah.

The original Africa Hall, inaugurated that same year, became a vital venue for symposia, lectures, and cultural exchange, and remains an important part of GSU's campus today.

Building on this legacy, **The Africa Institute** was formally established on June 6, 2018, as a center for research, documentation, and postgraduate education in African and African diaspora studies. In 2023, following the Emiri decree, it became the first constituent institute within Global Studies University.

Today, **The Africa Institute** is recognized globally as a leading center for African and diaspora studies. Situated in the Gulf—a historical nexus of African-Arab exchange—the Institute fosters interdisciplinary collaboration within GSU and with partners worldwide, shaping new paradigms in African and global studies.

GSU aims to be a leading global studies institution, recognized for excellence in teaching, research, and knowledge production. We transcend traditional area studies and continental thinking frameworks by pioneering critical, interconnected, and interdisciplinary paradigms that redefine global studies.

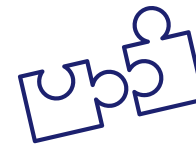

Academic Programs

Doctor of Philosophy in Global Studies

Overview

The five-year Ph.D. in Global Studies at Global Studies University prepares scholars to tackle the most pressing questions in the humanities and social sciences through interdisciplinary research and global perspectives. Students complete two years of coursework, followed by three years of dissertation research and writing, supported by expert faculty and extensive academic resources.

Program Highlights

Students pursue one of two interdisciplinary tracks:

Track 1: Cultural, Visual, and Literary Studies

- African Languages and Translation Studies
- History of Art, Visual Studies, and Performance Studies
- Literary and Cultural Studies

Track 2: Historical, Political, and Social Studies

- Historical Studies
- Social and Political Studies

Seven cross-cutting thematic fields enrich research across tracks: African-Arab Relations, Intellectual Thought in Global Studies, Diaspora Studies, Gender Studies, Political Economy, the Indian Ocean World, and the Muslim World.

Curriculum Structure

The program comprises 81 credit hours, combining advanced coursework, non-Western language study, comprehensive exam preparation, and original research. Students take foundational core courses, select interdisciplinary electives, and complete a dissertation, which is defended in a viva format.

Master of Arts

in Global African Studies

Overview

The MA in Global African Studies is a two-year interdisciplinary graduate program designed to train critical thinkers and researchers in African and African diaspora studies. Offered by The Africa Institute, it is set within a region shaped by historical Afro-Arab exchange and global connections, combining academic rigor with cultural immersion and practical experience. Students join a dynamic intellectual community and benefit from mentorship by international scholars engaged in cutting-edge research.

Program Highlights

Students pursue one of three specialization tracks:

- Track 1: Afro-Arab Relations
- Track 2: Museum and Critical Heritage Studies
- Track 3: Diplomacy and Africa’s International Relations

Alongside their chosen track, students engage with broader themes such as diaspora studies, gender, the Indian Ocean world, and African thought in Muslim contexts.

Students complement their specialization with interdisciplinary coursework that encourages critical thinking, comparative analysis, and understanding of Africa’s historical and global connections. Through this approach, they develop intercultural awareness and gain insights into African languages, politics, cultures, and societies.

Our Languages and Translation Program offers immersive community courses in Arabic, Amharic, Kiswahili, and Hausa, designed for non-native speakers. Each 72-hour course is available at Elementary, Intermediate, and Advanced levels, with both in-person and online options. Launched in 2023, the program is expanding rapidly, fostering cultural understanding and providing increasing opportunities to study these languages in the UAE and beyond.

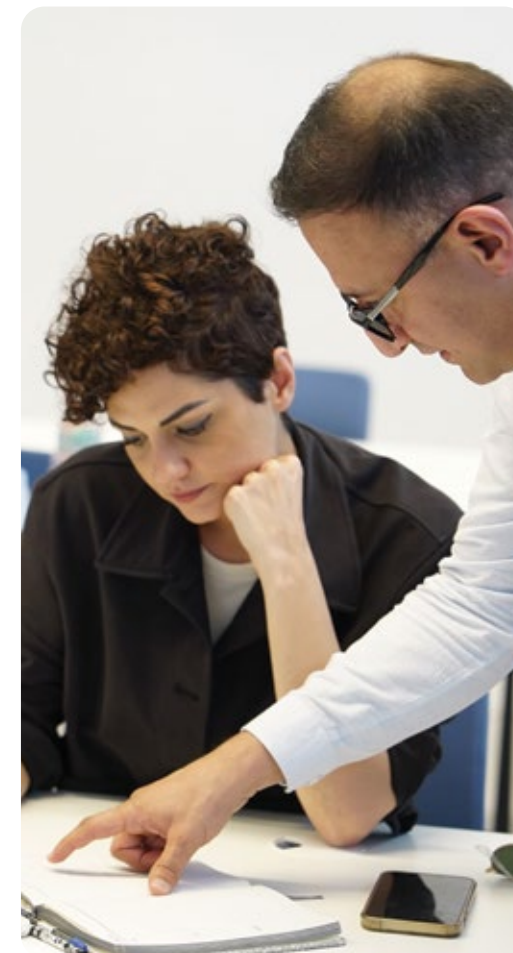
Our courses are community-driven, practical, and career-oriented, designed to give learners real-world language skills and cultural insights.

72-hour courses at Elementary, Intermediate, and Advanced levels, combining oral, written, and cultural practice.
- **Innovative teaching**
Expert faculty use the Communicative Language Teaching (CLT) approach, integrating multimedia, immersive experiences, and cultural materials.
- **Career-focused**
Skills developed in the program prepare learners for global opportunities in translation, international relations, education, heritage, tourism, social services, business, and more.

Tejumola Olaniyan Creative Writers-in-Residence Fellowship

A three-month residency in Sharjah, UAE, honoring the late Nigerian scholar Tejumola Olaniyan. Open to novelists, playwrights, poets, and scriptwriters exploring Africa and its diaspora, with projects in Arabic, English, or other languages.

Global Africa Translation Fellowship

A non-residential fellowship supporting translations of African and African Diaspora texts into English, Arabic, or other languages, making these works accessible to a global readership.

Workshops: Hands-on sessions enhance research, writing, language skills, and creative practice, fostering practical expertise alongside critical thinking.



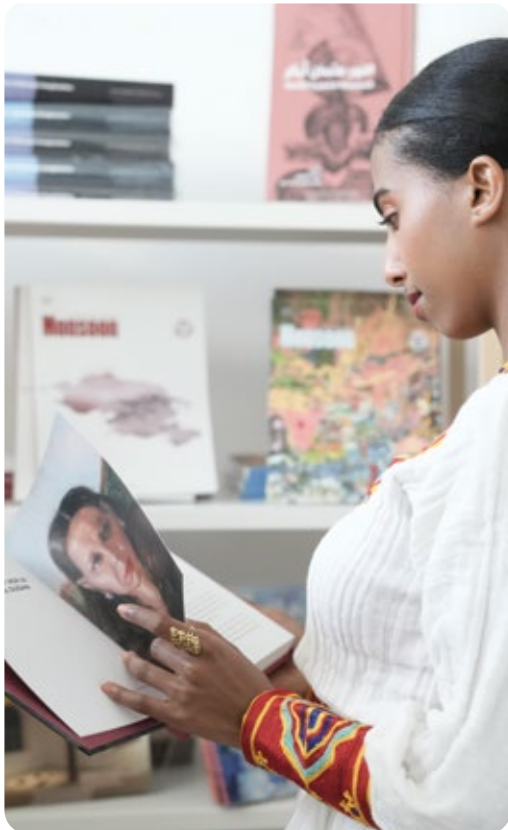

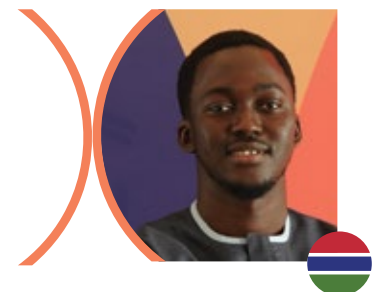
